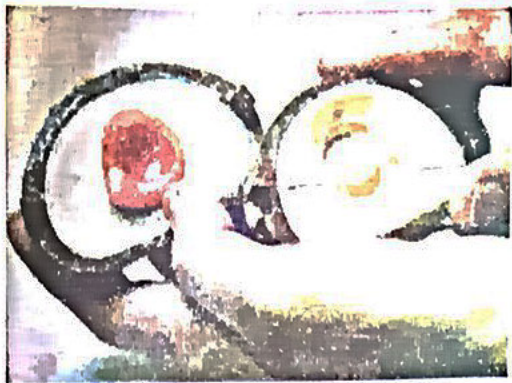


# She's Matchless At Matching Eyes



LaDonna Swan paints iris for artificial eye, a skill which enables her to match patient's normal eye.

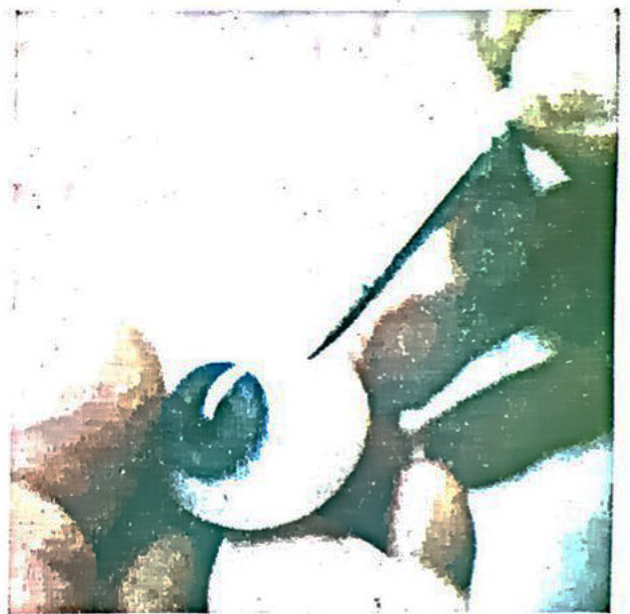


One of the first steps is to make a wax model of socket impression.

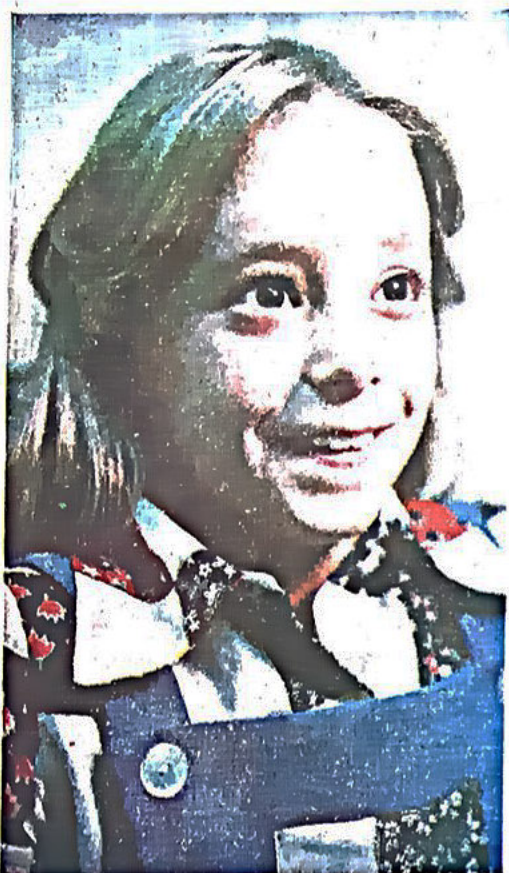


The cornea is inserted as the eye is constructed.
